Muslims in poor and remote communities in Africa are in urgent need for mosques, as their role goes beyond being a place where one can practice religious rituals. Program's message

At times, religious sites are the liveliest centre of community life in Africa's poor villages. Various lectures, Quran memorization sessions, and other religious activities are held in mosques. In addition, social occasions such as marriages, funerals, and conflict resolutions are also held in mosques. As such, in line with Africa's 2063 agenda goal of providing a high standard of living, DirectAid aims to provide individuals with an adequate space to practice their religious beliefs and get together¹. This initiative also supports the United Nations' sustainable development goals of promoting peaceful and inclusive societies, allowing them to rise together for the better of their communities, countries, and continent .

Specifications of mosques built

Mosques, of areas 100 m² to 400 m², contain concrete ceilings, ceramic and concrete floor. In addition, they are also entirely covered by carpets, speakers, and toilets. In other words, they are equipped to allow individuals to sustainably practice their rituals comfortably. As a result, the building of mosques can cost from USD 23,057 to 164,691, depending on its design, surface area, and location.

As of 2021, 6,000 mosques were built by DirectAid in some of the neediest areas in African countries.
